Homily: "Joyful Love"

Poem (Steve Garnaas-Holmes – adapted) What if God is joy? What if God is bliss and Jesus is gratitude and the Holy Spirit is gleeful wonder? What if creating is God's play, and the big bang was an outburst of happiness and the galaxies are spun from pure delight? What if gravity, that holds the universe together, is simply the pleasure of harmony, and every created thing's ecstatic desire for one another? What if earth is God's areat celebration, spinning and dancing and making music and beauty and inviting everyone in to feast and wonder? What if being itself is such a miracle that God gets endless enjoyment out of it? What if God doesn't own a throne (most uncomfortable) and has never handled a gavel, but has a million musical instruments? What if God goes to hell every weekend with a load of tissues and listens to everybody who's locked themselves up in there until they've cried out all their sorrows, and they come out laughing and dancing?
