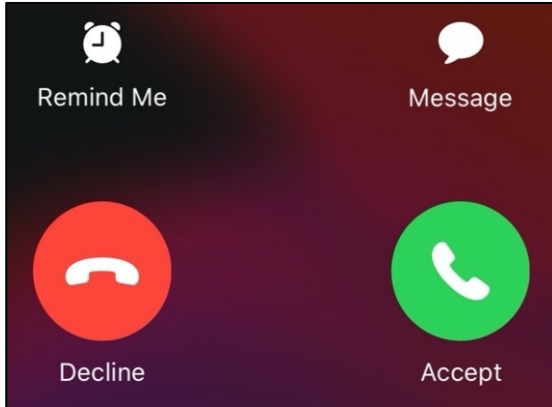

Community Prayer (*Walter Brueggemann – adapted*)

You are the God who calls people like us, and the long list of mothers and fathers before us, who trusted the promise enough to keep the call. We pray enough of your grace and mercy among us that we may be among those who believe your promises enough to respond to your call. We pray in the one who embodied your promise and enacted your call, even Jesus. Amen.

Scripture Lesson: Psalm 22:23-31 (*A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney*)

You who revere the Font of Life, praise her! All the offspring of Leah and Rachel, Bilhah and Zilpah, glorify her. Stand in awe of her all of you of Rebekah's line.

24 For she did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted; she did not hide her face from me, and when I cried to her, she heard. **25** On your account is my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who revere her. **26** The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek her shall praise the Mother of All. May your hearts live forever! **27** All the ends of the earth

shall remember and turn to the Wellspring of Life; and all the families of the nations shall worship before her. **28** For sovereignty belongs to She Who Is Holy, and she rules over the nations. **29** They continue and they bow down, all the fat ones of the earth before her, they bend their knees, all who go down to the dust, and cannot save their soul. **30** Later descendants will serve her; future generations will be told about our God, **31** they will go and proclaim her deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that she has done it.

Scripture Lesson: Matthew 4:18-23 (*A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney*)

As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea for they were fisherfolk. **19** And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people—women, children and men." **20** At once they left their nets and followed him. **21** As Jesus went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. **22** At once they left the boat and their father and followed him. **23** Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the realm of God and curing every disease and every malady among the people—women, children and men.
