Burying Our Alleluias

Call to Worship (Thom Shuman – adapted)

Scripture Lesson: Psalm 22:23-31 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney)

You who revere the FONT OF LIFE, praise her! All the offspring of Leah and Rachel, Bilhah and Zilpah, glorify her Stand in awe of her all you of Rebekah's line. **24** For

she did not despise or abhor the affliction or the afflicted; she did not hide her face from me, and when I cried to her, she heard. 25 On your account is my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who revere her. 26 The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek her shall praise the MOTHER OF ALL. Then (Jesus) began to teach them that the Son of Humanity must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. 32 He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. 33 But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." 34 He called the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. 35 For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. 36 For what will it profit them to gain

the whole world and forfeit their life? **37** Indeed, what can they give in return for their life?
