Singing Our Way In: "God is Good, All the Time" (unknown – adapted)

God is good, all the time All the time, God is good God is good, all the time All God's people singing God is good

God is <u>Grace</u>, all the time ... God is <u>Peace</u>, all the time ... God is <u>Love</u>, all the time ...

Call to Worship (Evangelical Church in America – adapted) One: Celebration rises, up from the deep places, the deepest places,

ALL: Lift every voice and sing, till earth and heaven ring, ring with the harmonies of liberty;

One: Celebration rises, with gratitude for the strength, the love, the vitality, the joy, the vision of lives past and present.

ALL: let our rejoicing rise high as the listening skies, let it resound loud as the rolling sea.

One: Celebration rises, though not blind to the suffering, the sorrow, the struggle along the way.

ALL: Stony the road we trod, bitter the chastening rod, felt in the days when hope unborn had died;

One: Celebration rises, remembering the way we have come, the paths taken that have brought us here to this place and time of celebration. Celebration rises, up and up, full of remembering and resilience.

ALL: yet with a steady beat, have not our weary feet come to the place for which our parents sighed?

One: Celebration rises, recognizing what has been done and left undone, knowing there is still and yet much to do, so much further to go. Celebration rises, naming the victories, recognizing the challenges yet ahead. Celebration rises on voices offering unfinished praise.

ALL: Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us;

One: Celebration rises, resisting illusions, to be embraced by the real and abiding presence of God who breaks all of our chains, and sets us free for freedom, in power and love and joy.

ALL: sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us;

One: Celebration rises, with the power of healing, reconciliation, restoration, reparation. Celebration rises with the promise to endure. Celebration rises, knowing that beneath the shadow of God's hand, the fullness of my humanity does not diminish yours and the fullness of your humanity does not diminish mine.

ALL: facing the rising sun of our new day begun, let us march on till victory is won. Alleluia! Alleluia!

Rosamond Johnson / lyrics: James Weldon Johnson) Lift every voice and sing, till earth and heaven ring, ring with the harmonies of liberty; let our rejoicing rise high as the listening skies, let it resound loud as the rolling sea. Sing a song full of the faith that the dark past has taught us; sing a song full of the hope that the present has brought us; facing the rising sun of our new day begun, let us march on till victory is won.

Scripture Lesson: Isaiah 40:25-31

To whom then will you compare me, or who is my equal? says the Holy One. **26** Lift up your eyes on high and see: Who created these? God who brings out their host and numbers them, calling them all by name; because God is great in strength, mighty in power, not one is missing. **27** Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the HOLY ONE, and my right is disregarded by my God"? **28** Have you not known? Have you not heard? The HOLY ONE is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. Scripture Lesson: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! 17 For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. 18 What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel. 19 For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. 20 To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. 21 To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. 22 To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. Communion / The Great Thanksgiving (Steve Garnaas-Holmes – adapted)

One: God is with you. ALL: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to God and to each other.

One: Let us give thanks to the Holy One, our God.

ALL: It is good and beautiful to give God our praise.

One: God of love and liberation, we give you thanks, for you create the world as a flowering of your goodness. You set free the oppressed and heal the broken. You walk with us in new directions – healed, made new, and full of your light. Your mercy flows freely, and we open ourselves to its life-giving light. We hunger for your grace, and feast on your generosity. Therefore with all Creation, we join in singing your praise:

ALL SING (TFWS #2257-b, tune: Mark Miller / lyrics: UM Hymnal): Holy, holy, holy (One); God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! (3x) Blest is the one who comes in the name of (our God). Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

One: Blessed are all who come in your name, and blessed is Jesus, your Christ. He healed people's bodies and souls, offering wholeness. He restored relationships and communities. He confronted inequity and injustice, and in retaliation the powers of evil crucified him. But in love you raised him from the dead, healing life itself, faithful to your covenant that we may have life, and have it abundantly. On the night before he would be betrayed ... And so we remember. As often as we break the bread and share the cup, we remember. We taste the same Spirit, we feast on the same promise and renew our commitment to follow the same path, as we proclaim mystery at the heart of our faith:

One: Pour out your Spirit on these gifts of bread and cup, tangible symbols for us of Jesus' body, Jesus' life, given in love, for love. Pour out your Spirit on us, that we may be for the world your body, O God – given in love, for love. As we share again this sacred meal, renew us as your people, inspire us toward your purpose, and enliven us with your power. By your Spirit, make us one with you, one with each other as with ourselves, and one in your covenantal work of restoring life – until all share in its fullness. With all Creation we await that time and we praise your name:
