One: In every tweeted, IM'd, emailed, Zoomed, phoned
greeting to reach out to another.

**ALL: The need to distance ourselves making clear how much
we need and want each other—this is life.**

One: In every risk taken willingly, every sacrificing of safety to
bring food or healthcare or presence to another.

**ALL: Rising above fear to remain human, compassionately
human—this is life.**

One: In every sunrise savored, every birdsong treasured, every
laugh or walk or dance or playful stirring of delight.

**ALL: Turning aside despair with glimpses of goodness—this is
life.**

One: These are the gifts of God; these are life rising; these are
resurrection.

**ALL: Even now, even here, God stirs, releasing our buried

Community Prayer (*John Pritchard*)

Today, O God, we praise you, for the news of life, new life, resurrected life, but our alleluias are muted, dampened by the dim news that surrounds us, of sickness and death, of loss and isolation, of hardship and struggle and costly sacrifice, of bravado masking fear and of fear undermining life and joy and love.

We live as if in the long, lonely, painful Saturday following Friday's cross, so it is hard to hear, to give ourselves to, Sunday's news, of a tomb emptied, of life risen.

Hold us, we pray, this subdued Easter. Tune our ears and hearts, not to trumpets blaring triumph, but to small hints of life in our Galilees, our scaled-back everydays where you meet us.

Grant us to hear your whispers, summoning life, new life, full life, even from the ruins of these days. Breathe in us the strength and hope of your Spirit. Amen.

Scripture Lesson: Jeremiah 31:1-6

At that time, says the LORD, I will be the God of all the families of Israel, and they shall be my people. **2** Thus says the LORD: The people who survived the sword found grace in the wilderness; when Israel sought for rest, **3** the LORD appeared to him from far away. I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you.

4 Again I will build you, and you shall be built, O virgin Israel! Again you shall take your tambourines, and go forth in the dance of the merrymakers. **5** Again you shall plant vineyards

Scripture Lesson: Matthew 28:1-10

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. **2** And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. **3** His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. **4** For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. **5** But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. **6** He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. **7** Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."
