Call to Worship (Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ, Green Group – adapted)

One: In the beginning, the Spirit of God moved over the waters,

Scripture Lesson: John 20:19-29 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney)

When it was evening on that day, the first of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples (gathered) were closed for fear of the Judeans, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you all." 20 And having said this, Jesus showed them his hands and his side, and then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Messiah. 21 Jesus said to

them again, "Peace be with you all, just as the God of Peace has sent me, so I send you all." **22** When Jesus had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit; **23** if you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

24 But Thomas, one of the twelve who was called Didymus (the Twin), was not with them when Jesus came. 25 So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Messiah." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." 26 And within eight days his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, though the doors were shut, and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you all." 27 Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and look at my hands. Bring your hand and put it in my side and do not doubt, rather believe." 28 Thomas answered him, saying, "My Savior and my God!" 29 Jesus said to him, "Was it because you have seen me that you believed? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe."
