Singing Our Way In: "Live in Charity (Ubi Caritas)" (TFWS #2179, tune: Jacques Berthier / lyrics: from 1 Corinthians 13:2-8) Live in charity and steadfast love, live in charity, God will dwell with you.

Scripture Lesson: 1 John 4:7-21 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney – adapted)

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. 8 Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. 9 In this way God's love was revealed amona us: God sent God's only Son into the world so that we might live through him. 10 In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us and sent God's own Son to be the means of forgiveness for our sins. 11 Beloved, if God loves us thus, we ought also love one another. 12 God no one has ever seen. Yet if we love one another, God lives in us, and God's love is made complete in us. 13 By this we know that we abide in God and God in us, because God has given us God's own Spirit. 14 And we have seen and so testify that God has sent the Son of God as the Savior of the world. 15 God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. 16 So we have known and have believed the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. 17 Love has been perfected among us in order that we may have boldness on the day of judgment, because as God is, so are we in this world, 18 There is no fear in love,

rather perfect love casts out fear; for fear relates to punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. 19 We love because God first loved us. 20 If someone says, "I love God," and hates their siblings, they are a liar; for those who do not love a sibling whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. 21 The commandment we have from God is this: those who love God must love their siblings also.

Scripture Lesson: John 15:1-6

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. 2 He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. 5 I am the vine, you are the branches.
