Scripture Lesson: John 10:1-10

Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the
sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a
thief and a bandit. **2** The one who enters by the gate is
the shepherd of the sheep. **3** The gatekeeper opens the
gate for the shepherd, and the sheep hear the

shepherd's voice. The shepherd calls their own sheep by name and leads them out. **4** When the shepherd has brought out all their own, the shepherd goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow the shepherd because they know the shepherd's voice. **5** They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from them because they do not know the voice of strangers."

6 Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. **7** So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. **8** All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. **9** I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. **10** The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."
