Scripture Lesson: Matthew 28:1-10 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney)

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. **2** And look! There was a great earthquake, for a messenger of God, descending from heaven, came and away the stone and sat upon it. **3** Its appearance was like lightning, and its clothing white as snow. **4** For fear of the messenger, the guards shook and were as though dead. **5** But the messenger responded to the women and said, "Fear not; I know that you all are looking for Jesus who was crucified. **6** He is not here; for he has been raised, just as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. **7** Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and see, he is on to Galilee ahead of you; there you will see him.' This is my message for you."

8 So the women left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to tell his disciples the news. 9 Then all of a sudden Jesus met them and said, "Shalom!" And they came to him, took hold of his feet, and bowed down worshipping him. 10 Then Jesus said to them, "Fear not; go and tell my sisters and brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

Scripture Lesson: John 20:1-18 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney)

Now it was the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene came, early on while it was still dark, to the tomb and saw the stone removed from the tomb. 2 So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Messiah out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." 3 Then Peter and the other disciple came and went to the tomb. 4 The two were running together, but the other disciple ran ahead of Peter and reached the tomb first. 5 And bending down to see, saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not enter. 6 Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb, and he saw the linen wrappings lying there 7 and the facecloth that had been on Jesus' head not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up separately in another place. 8 Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, went in and saw and believed. 9 Indeed they did not understand the scripture, that it was necessary for Jesus to rise from the dead. 10 Then the disciples returned once more to their homes.

11 Now Mary stood outside, facing the tomb, weeping. As she wept, she bent down to see in the tomb. 12 Then she saw two angels in white sitting, one at the head, one at the head and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had been lying. 13 They said to her, "Woman, why do you weep?" She said to them, "Because they have taken my Savior, and I do not know where they have laid him." 14 Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. 15 Jesus said to her, "Woman, why do you weep? For whom do you look?" Thinking that he was the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." 16 Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned and said to him in Aramaic, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). 17 Jesus said to her, "Do not hold me, because I have not yet ascended to my Abba. Rather, go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Abba and your Abba, to my God and your God." 18 Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Savior"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.
