Scripture Lesson: 1 Peter 2:4-10 (A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney)

Come to Jesus, a living stone, although rejected by humanity yet chosen and precious to God. **5** And you yourselves, like living stones, being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. **6** Thus scripture contains: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen, precious; and whoever believes in that stone will

not be put to shame." **7** To you all who believe then, a precious honor; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone," **8** and "A stumbling stone, and a rock of offense." ALL: We open them up to God and to one another. One: Let us give thanks to the Holy One, our God.

ALL: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

One: It is right, O God, and a joyous thing to praise you, who spins the web of all creation and breathes life into us. You etch your image into each person and give us to one another that we may find and honor your presence. You nourish us by each other's love, strengthen us by each other's support, delight us by each other's presence, and sculpt us by each other's witness. Through life's challenges, you continue to stir life, awakening a dormant creation and causing it to rise. And so, with all your people on earth, with the great company of the heavens and all creation, we praise your name and join the unending hymn:

One: Stir up your Spirit now as we join together in this holy meal. By your Spirit, make us living stones – one with each other in love, one in Jesus' passion for justice and wholeness, one in celebration of your grace weaving all creation into one blessed family. With all who have lived and will live and are living now, we praise your name.
