Scripture Lesson: Hosea 5:15-6:6

I will return again to my place until they acknowledge their guilt and seek my face. In their distress they will beg my favor: **6:1** "Come, let us return to the Holy One; for it is God who has torn, and God will heal us; God has struck down, and God will bind us up. **2** After two days God will revive us; on the third day God will raise us up, that we may live before God. **3** Let us know, let us press on to know the Holy One; God's appearing is as sure as the dawn; God will come to us like the showers, like the spring rains that water the earth." **4** What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes away early. **5** Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets, I have killed them by the words of my mouth, and my judgment goes forth as the light. **6** For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice, the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.

Scripture Lesson: Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26

As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. **10** And as he sat at dinner in the house, many tax collectors and sinners came and were sitting with him and his disciples. **11** When the Pharisees saw this, they said to his disciples, "Why does your teacher eat with tax collectors and sinners?" **12** But when he heard this, he said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. **13** Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners."

18 While he was saying these things to them, suddenly a leader of the synagogue came in and knelt before him, saying, "My daughter has just died; but come and lay your hand on her, and she will live." 19 And Jesus got up and followed him, with his disciples. 20 Then suddenly a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years came up behind him and touched the fringe of his cloak, 21 for she said to herself, "If I only touch his cloak, I will be made well." 22 Jesus turned, and seeing her he said, "Take heart, daughter; your faith has made you well." And instantly the woman was made well.
23 When Jesus came to the leader's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, 24 he said, "Go away; for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And

they laughed at him. **25** But when the crowd had been put outside, he went in and took her by the hand, and the girl got up. **26** And the report of this spread throughout that district.

One: The word of God for the people of God. **ALL: Thanks be to God!**

One: God of Unfathomable Love, we thank you that life flowed from you at Creation and flows from you now – renewed with each breath. As those formed in your image, we need only touch the hem of your garment to know your healing power. Within the free flow of your mercy and grace, you transform our pitfalls into possibilities, our doubt to faith, our despair to hope, our fear to love. You bring us home to ourselves, and call us home to each other.

ALL: And so, with your people on earth, with all Creation, and with the full company of heaven, we praise your name and join the unending hymn:

One: Blessed are all who come in your name and Spirit, and blessed is Jesus, your Christ, who embodied your mercy and grace. He fed the hungry and stood with the outcasts, healed the sick and restored the broken. He brought even the dead to life. He washed his disciples' feet and shared a holy meal with them, a meal reaffirming your covenant to be always with us in love.

On the night ... And so as we break the bread and share the cup, we remember.

ALL: Held in and bound together by that same love, we taste the same Spirit and feast on the same promise, as we proclaim the mystery at the heart of our faith:

ALL SING (TFWS #2257-c, tune: Mark Miller / lyrics: UM Hymnal): Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

One: Pour out your Spirit on all of us gathered here, in person and virtually. Pour out your Spirit on these gifts of bread and cup, and on those elements we use to remember this holy meal. Make them be for us Christ's body, broken, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, interconnected and interdependent. As Jesus called Matthew to follow, may this meal call us forth again to follow your way of mercy and grace – as much for the healing of the world as for our own. May your love flow in and through us toward life made whole for all. **ALL: By your Spirit make us one in love with you, with each other and with ourselves.** ALL SING (TFWS #2257-d, tune: Mark Miller / lyrics: UM Hymnal): Amen. Amen. Amen. / Hosanna in the highest! (3x)
