Call to Worship (*John Pritchard*)

One: Virtually gathered, spiritually united, welcome.

ALL: Peace—the peace of God's Spirit—be yours.

One: Gather, friends, as people of God, people who imagine otherwise.

ALL: We join as people of a story different from the tale shared around us,

One: a story in which all lives truly matter, especially those long ignored, devalued, trampled,

ALL: We join, though physically parted, to share a different story, a different spirit, a truly hopeful dream. We join in praise: Alleluia! Alleluia!
