Scripture Lesson: Psalm 24 (*A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church, Wilda C. Gafney – adapted*)

To the CREATOR OF ALL belongs the earth and all that fills her, the world, and those who dwell in her. **2** For God upon the seas has founded her, and on the rivers has established her. **3** Who shall ascend the hill of the HOLY ONE? And who shall stand in God's holy place? **4** (Those) who (have) clean hands and pure hearts, who (do) not lift up their hands to what is false, and do not swear deceitfully on their souls. **5** Instead they will lift up a blessing from the FAITHFUL GOD, and what is right from the God of their salvation. **6** Such is the generation of those who seek God, who seek the face of the God of Rebekah. **7** Lift up your heads, you gates! and be lifted up, you everlasting doors! that the One of glory may come in. **8** Who is the One of glory? Scripture Lesson: Amos 7:7-15

This is what God showed me: God was standing beside a wall built with a plumb line, with a plumb line in hand.

8 And the HOLY ONE said to me, "Amos, what do you

see?" And I said, "A plumb line." Then God said, "See, I am setting a plumb line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; **9** the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword." **10** Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you in the very center of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. **11** For thus Amos has said, 'Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land.'" **12** And Amaziah said to Amos, "O seer, go, flee away to the land of Judah, earn your bread there, and prophesy there; **13** but never again prophesy at Bethel, for it is the king's sanctuary, and it is a temple of the kingdom." **14** Then Amos answered Amaziah, "I am no prophet, nor a prophet's son; but I am a herdsman, and a dresser of sycamore trees, **15** and the HOLY ONE took me from following the flock, and the HOLY ONE said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'
