Scripture Lesson: Genesis 22:1-14

After these things God tested Abraham. God said to him, "Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." **2** God said, "Take your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains that I shall show you." **3** So Abraham rose early in the morning, saddled his donkey, and took two of his young men with him, and his son Isaac; he cut the wood for the burnt offering, and set out and went to the place in the distance that God had shown him. **4** On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place far away. **5** Then Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; the boy and I will go over there; we will worship, and then we will come back to you."

6 Abraham took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. So the two of them walked on together. 7 Isaac said to his father Abraham, "Father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." He bound his son Isaac, and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. 10 Then Abraham reached out his hand and took the knife to kill his son. 11 But the angel of the Holy One called to him from heaven, and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" And he said, "Here I am." 12 God said, "Do not lay your hand on the boy or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from me." 13 And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. 14 So Abraham called that place "The Holy One will provide"; as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the Holy One it shall be provided."

One: Let us give thanks to God who takes risks for love. ALL: For the courage of the Holy that lives in us, we give thanks. One: Throughout history, O God, we have struggled to claim the power you have given us. Destructive forces within and around us make us question your call upon our lives. We turn ourselves over, in ways ordinary and remarkable, to what is. To what has been. To the familiar. But you have created us for so much more.

ALL: And so, empowered by you, we join together with your people on earth, with all Creation, and with the full company of heaven, praising your name and joining the unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy (One); God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

Blest is the one who comes in the name of (our God). Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

One: In Jesus, we saw a life lived in all its potential. In all its sacred power. Life that is abundant. Love that was creative, and fervent for justice. We saw, too, the consequences of living as if the kindom were close. And so we wonder: If we live with such courage, what will we lose? In proclaiming truths that confront unjust power, do we stand a chance of survival? How will it go for us, if we are willing to risk everything for love? You have never promised us safety, but you have shown us what is possible.

The Spirit brings new life even to places of death. For Jesus, knowing the dangers ahead, there was nothing he would trade for his love of the suffering and betrayed, not even his own life.

On the night ... And so as we break the bread and share the cup, we remember. And in remembering, we reclaim what Jesus taught us about ourselves – about the power God has given us. We remember that God enfleshed is good news that feeds, that protects, that heals, that loves.

ALL: Held in and bound together by that same love, may we taste the same Spirit and feast on the same promise, as we proclaim the mystery at the heart of our faith:

ALL SING (TFWS #2257-c, tune: Mark Miller / lyrics: UM Hymnal): Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

One: Pour out your Spirit on all of us gathered here, in person and virtually. Pour out your Spirit on this bread and this cup, O God, and on whatever elements we use to join in this holy meal. In our sharing, fill our hearts with courage to believe the kindom is within us, to live faithfully and boldly in pursuit of love that liberates, and to follow the wisdom that leads from the margins. **ALL: By your Spirit make us one in love with you and with each other, as with ourselves.**

ALL SING (TFWS #2257-d, tune: Mark Miller / lyrics: UM Hymnal): Amen. Amen. Amen. / Hosanna in the highest! (3x)

Sung Response: "Eat This Bread" (UMH #628, tune: Robert Batastini & Taizé Community / lyrics: Jacques Berthier) Eat this bread, drink this cup, come to me and never be hungry. Eat this bread, drink this cup, trust in me and you will not thirst.
